

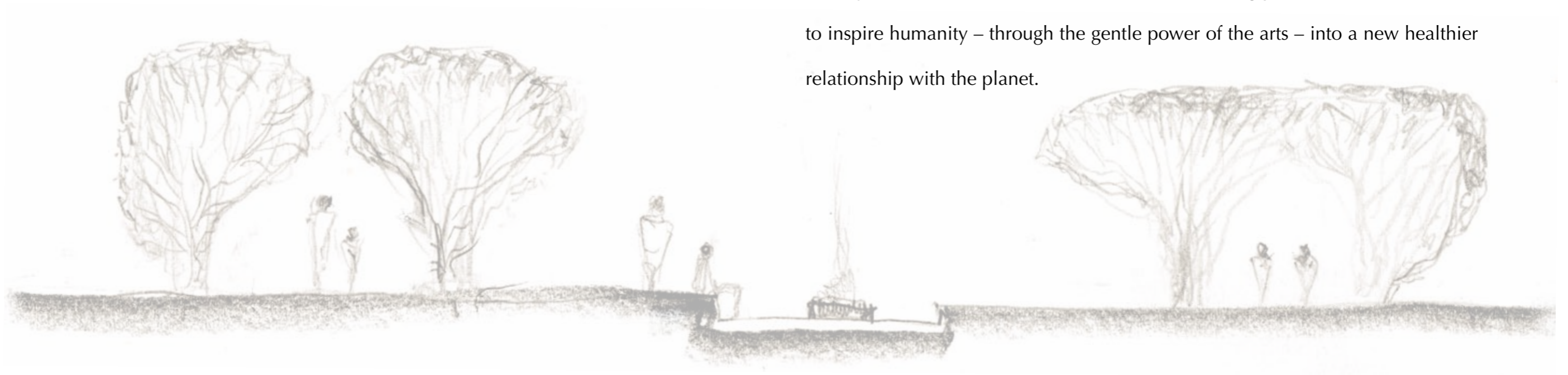

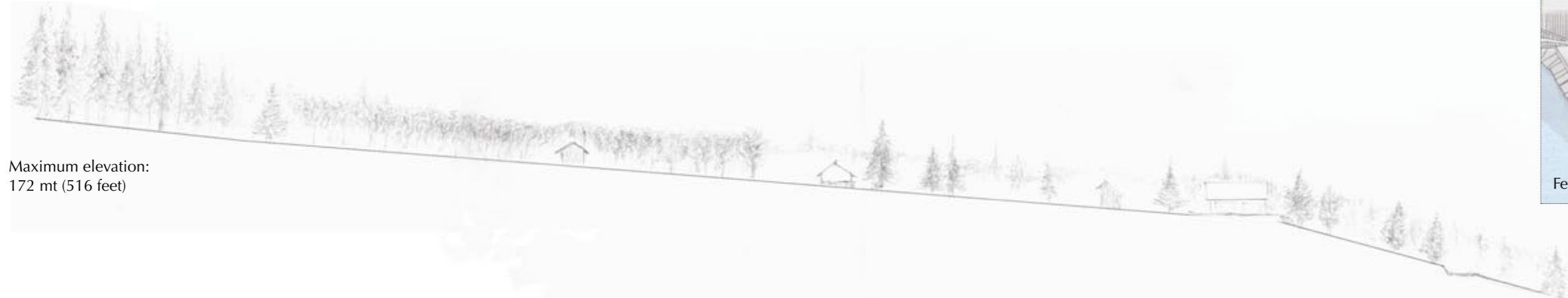
THE ART FARM

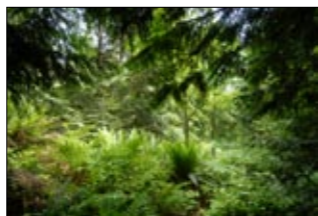
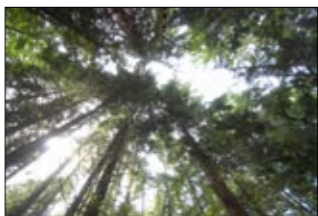
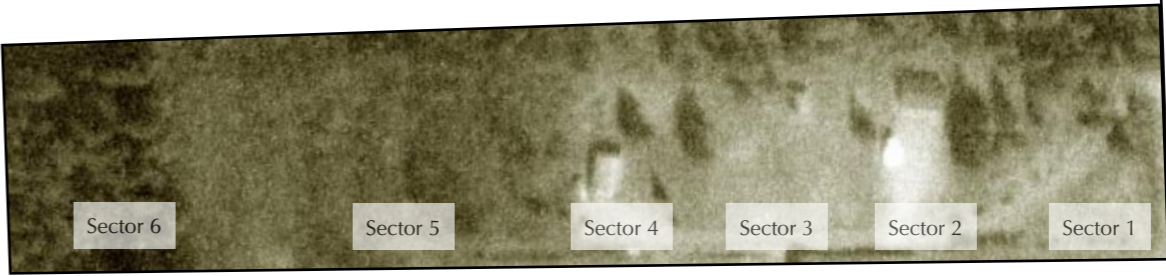
Site location & elevation

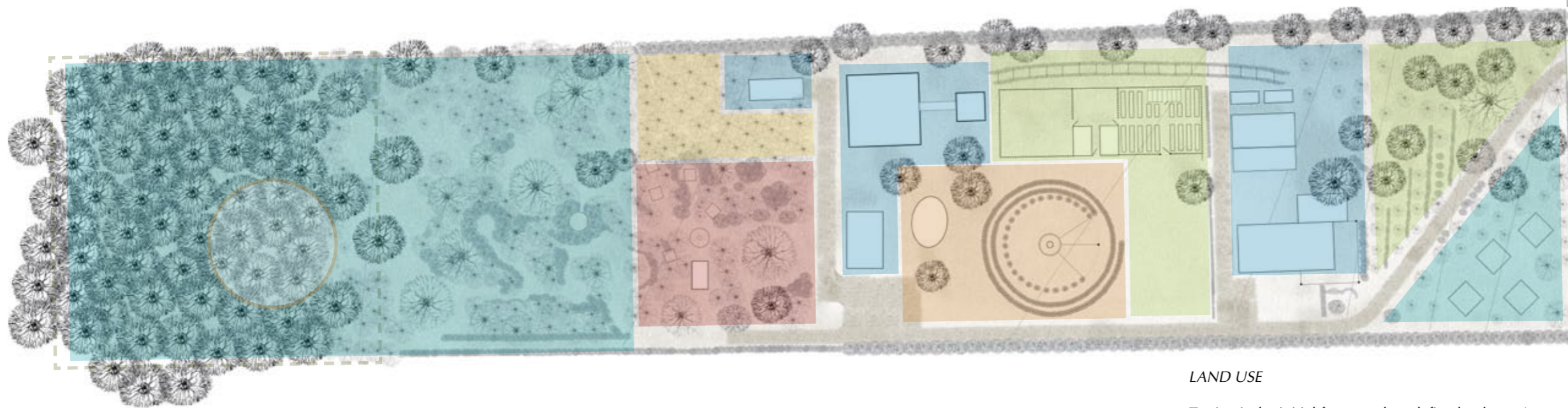

LAND USE

Zoning is the initial framework to define land use. As an art farm, the whole site is conceived as an art creation, and zone limits are blurred.

ART AND LAND

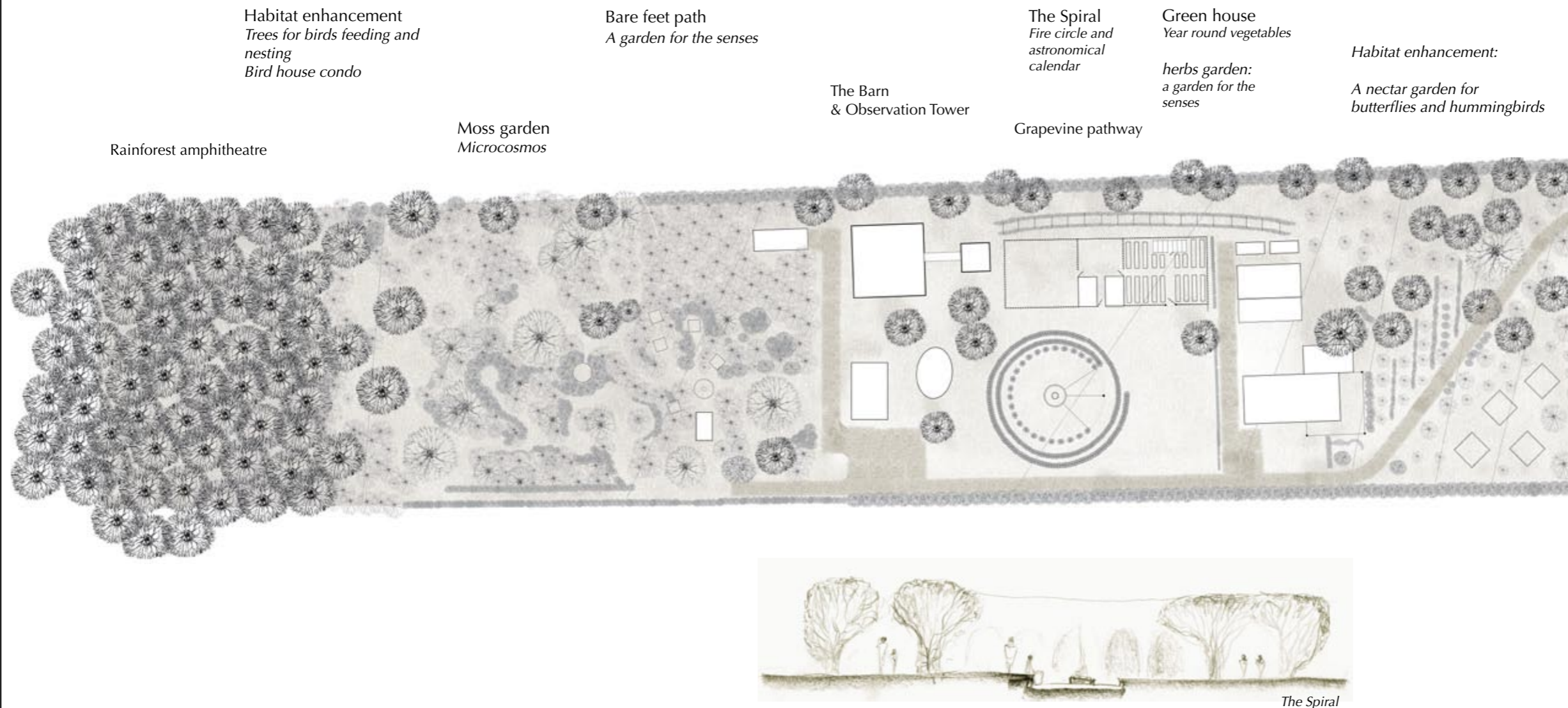
The art farm itself is an artistic creation. From sculpted wilderness to cultivated landscape to architectural design, our goal is to create a space that nurtures this inspiration for artists of all disciplines.

The art farm is a dialog with place; a collaboration with nature. Art serving the landscape, land serving the arts; a closed loop of inspiration and regeneration. Art for the senses, art for the imagination, art for life. Performance art as a return to the ceremonial, to the sacred in life. Time scale: ephemeral, temporary, long

term and permanent events, installations, viewings, performances and sculptures. Space scale: micro & macro cosmos, an experience of the different scales of the natural world – from the remarkable diversity of the moss garden to the awe-inspiring night-skies of the astronomical calendar.

THE FARM

Farm production serves the over-all vision of the project. From edible landscaping to habitat enhancement to technological self-sufficiency, all systems are designed with equal parts artistic elegance and respect for the land.



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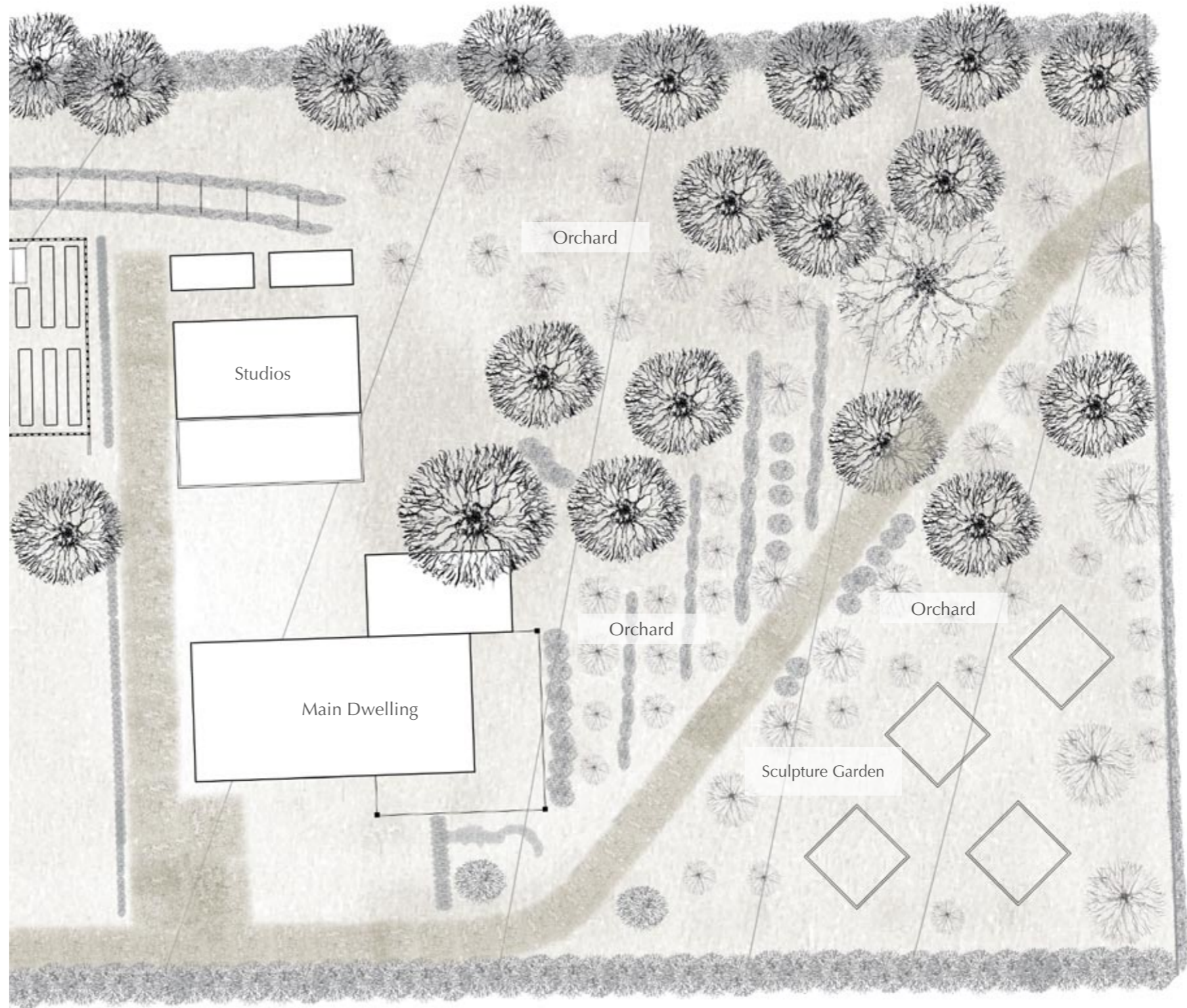

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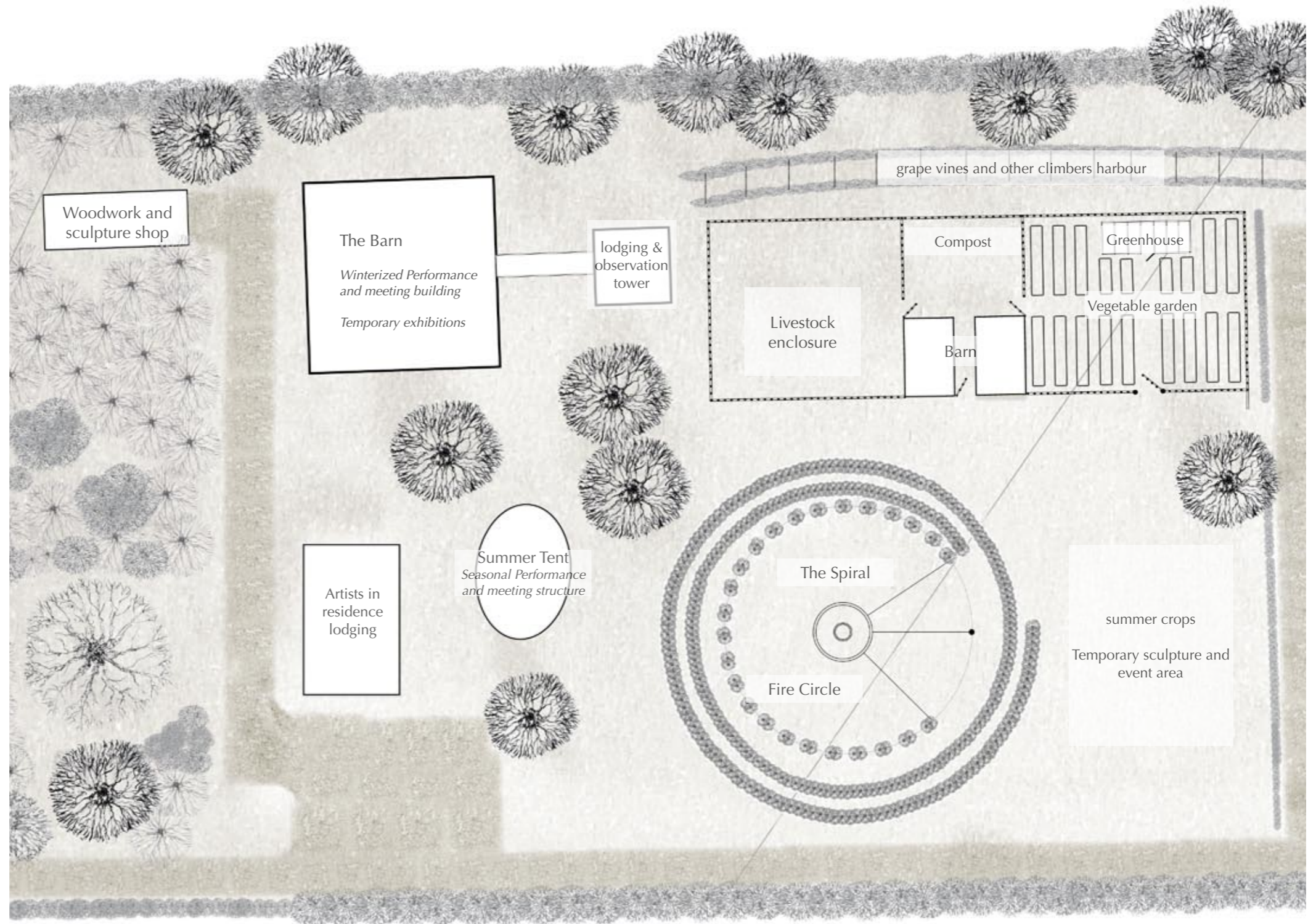
